Key entry dates and information

Close of Entries

Entries open on the Monday 1st January 2024 and close on Wednesday the 13th March at 5pm. Entries must be the exhibitors own work and cannot have been entered in a previous show. Two entries are allowed in each category *with the exception* of Photography, Juniors and Schools where only one entry is allowed. Juniors may only enter their own age category.

Delivery of Exhibits

The hall will be open on Thursday 14th from 7am to 7pm for the drop off of exhibits. Deliveries of *perishable* goods only (see below) will also be open between 8am and 11am on Friday 15th March.

Judging of exhibits will take place on Friday 15th March. The judging on non perishables will take place in the morning and the perishable sections (as listed above) will take place in the afternoon.

Preparation of Exhibits

Once entered into **Showday Online**, you will receive an acknowledgement email with details of your entries and duplicate exhibit cards for each entry. If you do not receive your acknowledgement within two days, please check your Junk/Spam folder and if it is not there, email Michele - entrysec@breamcreekshow.com.au. Once you have received the email, you will then need to print and cut the exhibit cards and **securely** attach them to your exhibits in such a way as they are clearly visible. One exhibit card needs to be attached to your exhibit and the other should be retained in order to collect your exhibit/s after the show. For those without access to a computer/email/printer, please contact us and we will make alternative arrangements for you. Cardboard plates and glad wrap will be available at the Hall at drop off if needed. Please ensure you read the handy hints document in relation to your Section.

Collection of Exhibits

Between 4pm and 5pm on Show day your exhibits can be collected from display in the Hall of Industries on presentation of your duplicate exhibit label. Entries can be left overnight and picked up the next morning but the Show takes no responsibility for entries not collected on Show day.

Collection of Prizes

All prize winners can pick up their prize money from the Show Office at any time on show day.
