#### **Preparation of Exhibits**

Once entered into **Showday Online**, you will receive an acknowledgement email with details of your entries and duplicate exhibit cards for each entry. If you do not receive your acknowledgement within two days, please check your Junk/Spam folder and if it is not there, email Suellen - <u>entrysec@breamcreekshow.com.au</u>. Once you have received the email, you will then need to print and cut the exhibit cards. One exhibit card needs to be securely attached to your exhibit and the other (which has your name on it) should be retained to collect your exhibit/s after the show. For those without access to a computer/email/printer, please contact us and we will make alternative arrangements for you. Paper/plastic plates and freezer bags will be available at the Hall at drop off if needed. To increase your chances of winning, please ensure you read the Handy Hints document in relation to your Section.

#### **Delivery of Exhibits**

The hall will be open on Thursday 13<sup>th</sup> from 7am to 6pm to drop off exhibits. Deliveries of *perishable goods only (see below)* will also be open between 8am and 11am on Friday 14<sup>th</sup> March as they will not be judged until 12pm.

#### **Judging of Exhibits**

Judging of exhibits will take place on Friday 14<sup>th</sup> March. The judging of non-perishables will take place in the morning and judging of the perishable sections (as listed on page 1) will take place in the afternoon.

#### **Collection of Exhibits**

The Hall is open between 9am and 4pm on Show Day. Your exhibits can be collected between 4.15 and 5pm from the Hall on presentation of your duplicate exhibit label. Entries can be left overnight and picked up the next morning, but the Show will take no responsibility for entries not collected on Show Day.

#### **Collection of Prizes**

Prizes and prize money can be picked up from the Show Office at any time on Show Day.

#### **Purchasing your Gate Ticket**

Exhibitors will need to purchase a gate ticket to enter on Show Day. This can be done in advance online at <u>www.breamcreekshow.com.au</u> or with cash/eftpos at the gate on Show Day.

## **Prizes:**
