- Exhibits **must not** have been entered in a previous Bream Creek Show.
- Exhibit cards must be securely attached.
- Late entries cannot be accepted.
- All exhibits will be judged but if deemed unworthy, prizes may not be awarded.
- There are two important documents for all exhibitors to read and understand - **CWA Winning Ways** (which explains the CWA judging criteria) and **Terms and Conditions** (which explains the Hall of Industries' rules and regulations). Both documents are available on our website and on **Showday Online**.

Important dates

Entries open on Sunday 1st February and close on Monday 16th March.

Entering exhibits

The preferred method for entries is via Showday Online

- Go to our website www.breamcreekshow.com.au
- Click on 'Hall of Industries'.
- Click on 'Enter online' and this will take you to Showday Online.

Once you have entered your entries into **Showday Online**, you will receive an acknowledgement email with details of your entries and duplicate exhibit cards for each entry. If you have not received it, check your Junk/Spam folder and if you haven't received them, email:

Preparation of exhibits

Once received, print and cut the exhibit cards. One exhibit card is to be securely attached to your exhibit and the other (which has your name on it) should be retained to collect your exhibits after the show.

For those unable to access a computer/email/printer, contact us and alternative arrangements can be made.

Delivery of exhibits to the showground

- **Thursday 19th March** between **7 a.m. and 6 p.m.**
- **Friday 20th March** between **8 a.m. and 11 a.m.** (for perishable exhibits only: fruit, nuts, eggs, vegetables, flowers and all cookery. Junior exhibits can also be delivered).

If you have any difficulty delivering exhibits email: chiefsteward@breamcreekshow.com.au who will direct you to drop off points or arrange alternatives.

Purchasing a gate ticket

Exhibitors need to purchase a gate ticket to enter on Show Day. This can be done in advance online at www.breamcreekshow.com.au or with cash/eftpos at the gate on Showday.

Judging of exhibits

Judging will take place on **Friday 20th March**.

Judging of non-perishables begins at **9 a.m.** **Judging of Perishables and Juniors** begins at **12 p.m.**

Collection of exhibits

On Showday the Hall will open for patrons between 9 a.m. and 3.45 p.m. and then close for 15 minutes to prepare for collection of exhibits. Exhibits and prize cards need to be collected on Showday between 4 p.m. and 5 p.m. on presentation of your duplicate exhibit cards.

The Show Society cannot take responsibility for any exhibit not collected on Showday, but the Hall will be open on Sunday morning between 10 a.m. and 12 p.m. for late collectors.

- Perishables will be disposed of at 12 p.m. on Sunday.
- Non-perishables will be disposed of after one week.

Collection of prizes and prize money

- Prizes and prize money can be collected from the Show Office between 12 p.m. and 5 p.m. on Showday.
- Uncollected prize money will be returned to the Show, unless prior arrangements have been made with the Entry Secretary.
